

UAE NEWS

- Value of transfers executed in the country's banking sector through the UAE Funds Transfer System (UAEFTS) reached AED 9.528 trillion during the first five months of this year.
- Dubai to welcome 10k millionaires. As of Dec-24, Dubai counts 81,200 resident millionaires, contributing to UAE's total of 130,500 dollar millionaires, 98% jump in the last decade.
- PFZC announced successful implementation of the 'One Freezone Passport' that enables companies licensed in 1 free zone to expand into others without additional licences.
- Presight seals strategic deal with Dow Jones Factiva to explore the co-development of a new class of Al-native risk and compliance solutions.
- 9-85% of UAE-based retail investors are currently invested in local stocks, and many are buying even more in response to global trade tensions.
- Al Reem Island cemented its position as the leading residential investment destination in UAE capital achieving 38% YoY increase in offplan property weighted average prices in Q2.

ISLAMIC BANKING NEWS

- Kuwait: Gulf Bank received initial approval from Central Bank to convert operations to an Islamic banking institution. News comes as Gulf Bank is exploring potential merger with Warba Bank.
- KSA Jabal Omar Development Company secured a SAR 2 billion Murabaha deal with Al Rajhi Bank to help refinance existing facilities, and improve the mortgage structure against loans.

GCC NEWS

- The United States emerged as the top source of greenfield foreign direct investment (FDI) in Saudi Arabia in the first half of 2025, accounting for 61 projects valued at \$2.7 billion.
- Most stock markets in the Gulf were restrained on Tuesday as oil prices fell and investors awaited signals from the U.S. Federal Reserve's annual Jackson Hole conference later this week.

COMMODITIES

- Gold hit a near three-week low as the dollar firmed, while investors awaited the Federal Reserve's Jackson Hole symposium later this week for clues on the path for monetary policy.
- Oil prices little changed as investors await the next steps in talks to end Russia's invasion of Ukraine, leaving in place sanctions on Russian crude & chance of further restrictions on its buyers.

FOREX NEWS

- USD gained for a third straight session on Wednesday as traders awaited the Federal Reserve's annual Jackson Hole symposium this week for clues on the path of monetary policy.
- CAD hit its lowest in almost three weeks as oil prices fell and cooler domestic inflation data raised expectations the Bank of Canada would cut interest rates in the coming months.
